Ka Uruora is about our iwi collectively coming together to support each other thrive and grow.

I'm extremely pleased to say that our Ka Uruora programme is really starting to build, as more and more of our iwi whānau are coming on-board and participating in our services and accessing affordable kāinga solutions.

Last quarter, we were very pleased to welcome Ngati Ruanui into the Ka Uruora whānau. It's great to now have six of our Taranaki iwi collectively working together to support the growth of our Whanau. In the relatively short time we've been working, we have now supported 20 iwi whānau into home ownership in Taranaki. We are also working with a number of other whānau at the moment, so this number will continue to grow this year. Every single one of our whanau who make the journey to home ownership is a fantastic success and an inspiration for us to follow.

It has been great to work with our iwi partners to offer whānau a range of opportunities under our shared ownership programme, where we help share the cost of the whare so they are more affordable and accessible. In addition to working with Taranaki lwi to offer opportunities along the Coast, we have been working with Te Atiawa to support whānau acquire units in Ngamotu, and most recently (December) in Kohanga Moa (Inglewood). We feature the successes

of three of our whānau who acquired whare in Kohanga Moa last quarter in this pānui later below. We are continuing to grow the number of home ownership opportunities for our iwi members, so encourage all iwi members to participate by signing up to our education programme as the first step.

In addition to home ownership opportunities, we are also very excited to be able to work with our iwi partners to start offering rentals to expand the range of kāinga solutions for whānau.

Collectively, we have an initial programme of 40 new iwi rentals for our iwi whānau in development across Taranaki, that will be offered with an average rebate of 20% below market to help make them more affordable for our whānau. More units are also in planning stages, so we can continue to offer a long-term pipeline of opportunities for our iwi whānau.

The first units in our rental programme will be delivered by Taranaki lwi in Ökato this month! Further details of these units, and others in the pipeline are detailed later in this pānui, and on our website.

The key starting foundation to accessing our kāinga solutions and support is through our financial education programme. We have an awesome team of kaimahi who run these courses, and we are expanding the way we can offer this programme so more of our whānau can benefit. Knowledge is power, and we are doing everything we can to empower our whānau through these courses.

A great example was last quarter, where we collaborated with Otaraua Hapū to offer our programme to Hapū members, facilitated by Rangimokai Knuckey. We feature more on the success of this course in this pānui, which we will look to offer to other groups who are interested in supporting their iwi members. The total

number of iwi whānau who have now completed the programme is fast reaching 250 (237 at 31 December). We hope to triple this number in three years!

The other key offering in our programme is WhānauSaver — our collective iwi savings programme offered to support the intergenerational future of our whānau. All our iwi partners contribute financially to match the savings of our members, and if you whakapapa to more than one iwi, you can receive contributions from all your iwi — multiplying the growth of your savings!

We are very excited about the opportunity for WhānauSaver to make a massive difference in the lives of our whānau, especially our tamariki and mokopuna — we encourage you to sign up your pēpi from birth to maximise the savings contributions over time. We now have over [700] iwi members signed up, with over \$380,000 in savings. We're growing fast, so hope to celebrate 1000 iwi members this year!

#### Ngāti Ruanui Joins WhānauSaver

In an exciting development for Ka Uruora and WhānauSaver, this quarter Ngāti Ruanui became the sixth Taranaki iwi to join the WhānauSaver kaupapa. Timing allowed us to celebrate this at Taranaki Tū Mai, an inter-iwi competition featuring all eight Taranaki iwi. The occasion not only showcased the fiery competition and whakawhanaungatanga among the iwi but we also witnessed a surge in WhānauSaver registrations.

An email was circulated to all existing WhānauSaver members, asking those that whakapapa to Ngāti Ruanui to confirm their registration, as Ngāti Ruanui uri are eligible for their annual contribution, receiving a dollar-for-dollar match up to \$100.

Taranaki Tū Mai proved to be a great platform for WhānauSaver, with an influx of registrations on the day. Ka Uruora kaimahi enjoyed having the opportunity to engage with whānau ā kānohi, offering valuable insights into the various services that we provide. It was great to have our Ka Uruora Te Tauihu kaimahi and a few of the team from SuperLife join us to run the stall for the day, mihi ana ki a koutou.

Adding to the momentum, Ka Uruora also attended the Ngāruahine Whānau Day this quarter, spending a day at the pools alongside Ngāruahine uri. This provided a great opportunity for those contemplating WhānauSaver registration to sign up, ensuring that they don't miss out on the benefits offered by the initiative.

Excitement is building as WhānauSaver numbers continue to rise, and we're confident that this upward trend will persist into 2024. The increasing interest and engagement from various iwi, including Ngāti Ruanui, coupled with attending events such as Taranaki Tū Mai and the Ngāruahine Whānau Day, have been instrumental in driving the exponential growth of WhānauSaver, showcasing its effectiveness in reaching and benefiting a broader range of whānau.

In this quarter we welcomed a collaboration between our financial literacy kaupapa and Otaraua Hapū, a course that brought valuable knowledge and empowerment to the kaimahi of the hapū. At Ka Uruora, we take pride in working closely with local workplaces, iwi, and hapū to tailor courses that align with their unique needs and schedules.

Otaraua Hapū recently embraced the opportunity to equip their kaimahi with essential financial skills. The financial literacy course, aimed to provide practical insights and tools to navigate the ever-changing financial landscape. The sessions were structured to accommodate busy schedules. This flexibility allowed kaimahi to actively engage in the learning process without disrupting their mahi commitments -

The course covered a range of topics, from budgeting and savings strategies to investment basics and understanding credit scores. Facilitating the sessions was our very own Rangimokai Knuckey, a skilled facilitator and Otaraua uri, who guided participants through interactive discussions and hands-on activities, ensuring that the content was not only informative but also easily applicable to their daily lives.

By tailoring financial literacy courses to address the unique needs of each roopu, our aim is to empower individuals to make informed financial decisions, thereby building a secure future for themselves and their whānau

Ka Uruora is happy to announce the completion of our first affordable rentals on Old South Road in Ōkato. As Taranaki lwi finalised construction. we are currently reviewing rental applications from prospective tenants/whānau. The response has been overwhelming, with over 70 people registering their interest in these much-needed affordable whare. This strong demand underscores the pressing need for accessible rental options in our rohe. Ka Uruora are committed to addressing this need and are actively working to expand our rental portfolio to better serve whānau in need.

Papa Pounamu Expansion

Looking ahead, Te Atiawa has identified Barrett Street as the site for their next development and our next affordable rental opportunity in Ngāmotu. While currently a bare section adjacent to the old hospital, plans are underway to transform this space into a vibrant community of beautiful townhouse units. We anticipate work on this project will commence later this year, further expanding our efforts to provide affordable housing solutions for our whānau.

We recognise the critical importance of affordable housing in fostering thriving communities. Through our ongoing initiatives and partnerships, we remain dedicated to creating pathways to secure and sustainable housing for all whānau. 












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
